HOLY YEAR OF MERCY



St. Patrick's and The Mother's Shrine has been designated by Bishop Gaydos as a special place of prayer for pilgrims during the **Holy Year of Mercy**.

Jesus both demonstrated mercy and demanded it of his followers. Pope Francis points to the miracles Jesus worked, the relationships he formed, the parables he taught. His mercy prompted him to feed the hungry crowds; restore a son to his grieving mother; speak of the lost sheep, the lost coins, and the welcome shown to the prodigal son. In the parable of the servant who refused to imitate his master who forgave him a debt, Jesus makes it clear that mercy is the criterion for all his followers: "Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?"

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Rose of Lima- August 23. Born in 1586 in Lima, Peru, Isabel was exceptionally beautiful. Her beauty was so great that she was nicknamed "Rose." From an early age, she wanted to be a nun. As a young woman, Rose began to attract suitors. To deter these men, she began rubbing her face with pepper to make it blister and cropped her hair short. Against her parent's wishes at 23, she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. She had a life of extreme prayer, fasting, and penance living in a hut helping the poor and the sick. She sold lace and embroidery and took flowers she grew to help her family. St. Rose was the first person born in the Americas to be canonized. She died at the young age of 31.

Mary, Untier of Knots

The History Continued.....

To commemorate the turn of the century in the 1700, Wolfgang's grandson, installed a family altar in the church and commissioned Schmidtner to do a painting to be placed over the altar. Schmidtner was so inspired by the story of the saved marriage, he based his painting on it.

The image came to be venerated as Mary, Untier of Knots. The painting has survived wars, revolutions and secular opposition and continues to draw people to it.

The devotion to Mary, Untier of Knots, was localized to Germany during the 18th century, however, during the Chernobyl Nuclear Power Plant disaster, victims sought help through the intercession of Mary, Untier of Knots.

The first chapel with that name was built in Styria, Austria in 1989. The painter, Weiss, used a technique of painting under glass. It differs from the original because the artist took his theme from the Chernobyl tragedy.
