### FEBRUARY 12, 2017 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### "COME LET US ADORE HIM" PART II

"So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo test" (Mt 26: 40-41). In view of the quoted words of Jesus, we are introducing Eucharistic Adoration Fridays during Lent, from 9:45 am to 4:15 pm. The first of its kind shall take place on first Friday of Lent, March 3, 2017.

The program for the day shall include the following:

1. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, 9:45 am
2. Eucharistic Adoration Prayer with all present, 9:50 am
3. Individual hourly adoration, 10.00 am to 4.00 pm
4. Benediction, 4:05 pm
5. Parishioners are encouraged to register for an hour of participation to ensure a smooth beginning. Out of respect for the Eucharist, there should be at least two people present for every hour. You are encouraged to stop in any time while the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. Each of us may design how he or she would like to spend the hour before the Lord. However, we ask you to prayerfully consider the following:
  1. Scriptural Rosary - 15 mins
  2. Scriptural Reading - 15 mins
  3. Meditation - 15 mins
  4. Prayer of petition/Thanksgiving -15 mins or
  5. Spiritual /Prayers - for hour
6. There will be useful materials available at the back of the chapel for this gracious time in the presence of our Lord. For the invisible benefit, just listen to words of the Psalmist, "A day in your presence, O Lord, is better than a thousand elsewhere." (Psalm 84:1 - 11)

### SAINT OF THE WEEK



Saint Cyril (826-869) and St. Methodius (815-885)- February 14

Brothers Constantine (Cyril was his monastic name) and Methodius were born in Greece. Because their father was an officer in a part of Greece inhabited by many Slavs, these two brothers ultimately became missionaries, teachers, and patrons of the Slavic people. A decisive change in their lives occurred when the Duke of Moravia (Czech Republic) who was unhappy with the Latin Christianity preached in his Slavic family, summoned the brothers to teach and preach the Slavic language to his people. This mission was to be their lifetime concern. They started a school to train young men for the priesthood. They conducted liturgical services in Slavic and translated the Bible into the language.

Cyril died on a trip to Rome, but Metodius was consecrated as bishop and returned to Moravia. May we imitate their zeal to translate God's message so that others can understand it.
