FEBRUARY 5, 2017 FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"COME LET US ADORE HIM" Part I

"Adoration " is a form of worship we give to God. It is a prayer of expression of our love and devotion to God in His presence. The people of Israel, observed this form of prayer as far back as the time of Moses (Exodus 33:7-10). As devotional prayer, it is an act of homage before God, as did the three wise men (magi) before Infant Jesus(Mt 2:1-12).

In our days we speak of Eucharistic Adoration Devotion to the Lord in the Exposed Blessed Sacrament. It is a solemn prayer that involves songs, scriptural reading reflection (meditation), praises/thanksgiving, petitions and Benediction as noted in the rites. "During the exposition there should be prayers, songs, and readings to direct the attention of the faithful to worship Christ the Lord. To encourage a prayerful spirit, there should be readings from scripture with homily or brief exhortation to develop a better understanding of the Eucharistic Mystery...."

The Eucharistic Adoration can be as short as 30 minutes or less or extend for hours throughout the day and even during the night, providing there can be at least two people present before the Lord. It can be perpetual act of devotion for months or years. Thus the rite says "This liturgy extends the praise and thanksgiving offered to God in the Eucharistic Celebration to several hours of the day; it directs the prayers of the Church to Christ and through him to the Father in the name of the whole world." Eucharistic Adoration must usually be concluded with Benediction (service of Solemn Blessings with the Blessed Sacrament).

Reading: Mathew 5: 13-16:

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Scholastica (480-543)- February 10

According to tradition, she was the twin sister of St. Benedict, the founder of Western monasticism.

Twins often share the same interests and ideas. Therefore, it was no surprise that Scholastica and Benedict established religious communities within a few miles of each other. Born of wealthy parents in Italy, she consecrated her life to God from her earliest youth. The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Benedict was not allowed inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters. The twins sacrificed some of the opportunities they would have had as brother and sister in order to better fulfill their vocation to the religious life. Scholastica is the patroness of Benedictine nuns. Like her, may we strive to help women who desire to dedicate themselves to the Lord.

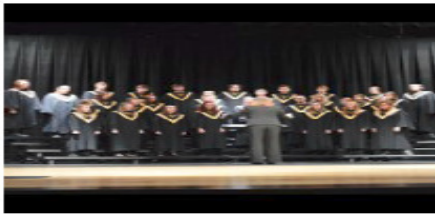
