### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Kateri Tekakwitha - July 14 Kateri was born in New York in 1656, the daughter of a Mohawk chief. At age four a smallpox epidemic killed her family and left her with impaired eyesight and a disfigured face. The scars were a source of humiliation in here youth. Kateri was known as a skilled worker, who was diligent and patient. When her adoptive parents proposed a suitor for her, she refused. They punished her by giving her more work to do, but she did not give in.

At age 19 after being inspired by missionaries, she converted to Catholicism. Her decision was very unpopular, so she escaped to a Christian native community south of Montreal. She had a strong devotion to the Eucharist and had a deep concern for others. She was canonized in 2012, the first Native American Saint. She is called the "Lilly of the Mohawks." Kateri died just five years after her conversion at the age of 24. May we follow her example of courageous dedication to faith.

### CATHOLIC CHURCH

There are five precepts of the Church that are binding to all her members.

They are "meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor." Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) #2041

The first precept is: "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor." CCC #2042

In the Diocese of Jefferson City, there are FIVE holy days of obligation:

- January 1, Mary Mother of God
- August 15, The Assumption of Mary
- November 1, All Saints Day
- December 8, The Immaculate Conception
- December 25, Christmas

All parishioners are expected to observe these days with the same fidelity as Sunday. However, when January 1, August 15 or November 1 fall on a Saturday or Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated. This means the obligation is removed for those days. In 2016, August 15 falls on Monday; therefore the obligation to attend Mass on that day is removed.

He said, "well if you are putting my wife on, I would like our daughter to be next to her", so he wrote a check for his daughter's name.

What started out as one name, grew to 10 then to 11. Their family tree is engraved on the Mothers' Wall of Life!
