SAINT OF THE WEEK



**Saint Teresa of Calcutta (1910-1997)-
Sept. 5**

Mother Teresa known as Saint Teresa of Calcutta was born in 1910 in Macedonia. In her early years, Teresa was fascinated by stories of the lives of missionaries. By age 12 she was convinced that she should commit herself to religious life. At the age of eighteen she left home to join the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland to learn English. She never saw her family again. Teresa arrived in India in 1929 to teach and she then took her religious vows in May, 1931. She enjoyed teaching in the school, but was increasingly disturbed by the poverty surrounding her in Calcutta. In 1946, Teresa heard the call to give up her life with the Sisters of Loreto and instead, to "follow Christ into the slums." She established a new religious community- the Missionaries of Charity. Her services were offered to orphans, abandoned children, alcoholics, the aging, street people, and the dying. For 40 years she worked on behalf of the poor. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. Mother Teresa's Sisters number nearly 4,000 in 123 countries in the world. Mother Teresa left a testament of unshakable faith, invincible hope, and extraordinary charity.

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Why Do Catholics Confess Their Sins to a Priest?

First, the Catholic is seeking forgiveness the way Christ intended it to be sought. Jesus himself delegated the authority to forgive sins (John 20:21-22:) Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Second, the Catholic receives sacramental graces that the non-Catholic does not get; through the sacrament of penance, not only are sins forgiven, but graces are obtained.

Third, the Catholic is assured that his sins are forgiven; he doesn't have to rely on a subjective "feeling."

Fourth, the Catholic can obtain sound and objective advice in analyzing his sins and avoiding sin in the future.

Fifth, the Catholic, by going to a recognized and trained confessor, is protected against the subjective dangers of such psychological tricks of the personality such as projection, rationalization, etc.

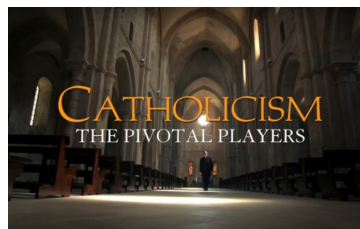

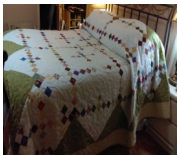
