"THIS IS MY BODY, THIS IS MY BLOOD "

Proudly we celebrate the solemnity of the Body of Christ -"Corpus Christi" today, 6/18/17. We affirm our faith in the Lord with clear understanding that what we receive at Mass is the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ including his soul and divinity. He told us of the need to eat his Body and drink his Blood in order to have life in him (Jn 6:41, 54-56). And he gave us the Eucharist during his last supper with affirmation that when we eat His Body and drink his Blood during the Eucharistic celebration, we proclaim His death until he comes in glory. (Lk 22:14-20/ 1Cor 11:23-26)

For sure we believe Jesus is the most truthful and faithful and that there are no lies in him. We equally believe that the power of the sacramental grace exists and that the sins of the priest can't prevent the effects of the sacrament. And so at the Mass we are consciously aware that through the action of the priest and pronouncement of the words of Christ, the bread and wine do become real Body and Blood. The effect, however, of the sacramental grace in us at the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ depends on our disposition.

On this note St. Paul taught us to have and maintain a proper disposition at the Eucharistic Meal. "Therefore whoever eats the Body (Bread) or drinks the Blood (cup) of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the Body and Blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup....."(1Cor 11:27-30). In line with Paul's teachings, the Church encourages us to confess all mortal sins or every sin before reception of Holy Communion. To achieve this, we prepare ourselves with the penitential rite at every Mass to ensure worthy reception of the Eucharist. Just know that the worthy reception of the Eucharist is your responsibility to receive with a good disposition and is your identity as Catholic.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Blessed Michelina of Pesaro (1300-1356)-
June 20 Born to a rich Italian family, Michelina married a Duke when she was twelve years old. She was a happy person by nature and did not seem to have a problem in the world. At age twenty, her husband died and left her with a young son to raise. Michelina tried to find happiness in parties, good meals, and the good things that life had to offer. After a while, she realized her life was empty and her son needed her. She became good friends with a holy Franciscan lay woman who guided her to prayer and caring for the sick and lonely. Her son died and she became a lay Franciscan. Her family thought she was mad and decided to lock her up. But after a while, they realized she was truly a holy woman. Michelina lived her whole life in the same house in Pesaro which is now a church. She died at the age of fifty-six.

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Catholics light candles during Mass to indicate the special solemnity of the occasion. Perhaps you are also referring to those stands which have small banks of candles that are lit for a special intention. They symbolize our prayers, our honoring God, or one of the Saints. The candles are known as votives or vigil lights. There is evidence that lit candles were burned at the tombs of the martyrs. Light has a special significance recalling how Jesus is "the light of the world." Vigil lights come from the Latin "vigilia" which means waiting or watching. Lighting a candle is a way of extending one's prayer and showing unity on whose behalf the prayer is offered.
